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Students in our twelve-week itinerant Digital Media Projects researched web sites relevant to current events, drawing specific links between globalization and the close-to-home struggles of communities of color: the dismantling of social programs, destruction of unions, the growing prison industrial complex, 3rd World sweatshops, and deteriorating living standards. Then they created individual or small group PowerPoint Presentations on social justice issues for nonprofit and service agencies that illustrated their "new take" on what's just and what's possible.

THE 5 VITAL STRATEGIES

When selecting service learning projects for social studies classes make sure you choose ones that

- 1. Address what your students agree are the pressing problems of their community;
- 2. Increase your students' understanding of the underlying (historical) causes that created and contributed to these problems;
- 3. Raise your students' skill level and ability by requiring them to research authentic, positive solutions and proven results;

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- 4. Identify multiple opportunities where students can showcase their work to receptive audiences using their own style and creativity;
- 5. Exceed State Board of Education standards by increasing students' class participation, confidence, and pride in their work through role play.

A PITFALL TO AVOID:

Bear in mind that student projects have to augment, not replace your own State's Standards. We strongly recommend that you begin with realistic goals you know can be achieved with the set time frame so that they and you don't get discouraged again.
